New Summit County Ski and Golf Pass Benefits Local Nonprofits

The Park City Foundation's Community Pass Features Skiing at PCMR & The Canyons and Seven Private and Public Golf Courses

Park City, UT- The Community Pass, a fully transferrable ski and golf pass, will benefit local nonprofits through an annual competitive grant program. With a total of twenty passes in its first year, The Foundation has only ten still available. For an \$8,000, partially deductible donation to The Community Fund at The Park City Foundation (PCF), donors receive 35 fully transferrable ski days at two area ski resorts and 9 foursomes at 7 public and private golf courses.

The ski and golf privileges were fully donated by all participating businesses to support our local nonprofit organizations. In addition to Park City Mountain Resort and The Canyons Resort, Glenwild Golf Club & Spa, Jeremy Golf and Country Club, Park City Golf Club, Promontory, Red Ledges Club, Talisker Golf at Tuhaye, and Victory Ranch Golf Club are contributing to the Community Pass program. It is through their and pass holders' generosity that PCF plans to raise almost \$160,000 for the Community Fund.

The Community Pass supports the Community Fund; an annual, competitive grant process for Summit County's charitable organizations. In 2008, the Community Fund granted over \$100,000 to 19 organizations- for operating costs, new and existing programs and for capacity building projects. Grants supported all types of nonprofit organizations: Children, Adults, Diversity, Education, Health, Environment, Civic, Animals, Art, Culture and Sports. Says Trisha Worthington, Executive Director of PCF, " The Community Pass is Summit County's only ski and golf pass, so donors get exclusive access in addition to supporting our community's most pressing and current needs."

The pass reflects all that Park City has to offer: golf courses in the heart of the city, over-looking the Jordanelle and in the Wasatch and Uintah Mountains and skiing in Utah's bottomless powder. Most importantly, however, it reflects our community's connectivity: " This Community Pass is an example of Park City's ability to cooperate and collaborate- nonprofits, private individuals, local businesses and the government all working together to support our community's interests," states Worthington.

The Park City Foundation connects private philanthropy with the greater Park City community by optimizing the impact of each charitable gift. As a community foundation, we offer professional strategies and services for our donors,

and support to strengthen local nonprofits for the betterment of the community.
